PAPTAC IN BRIEF





PAPTAC's main activities for the year 2019

PaperWeek Canada 2019



Over 800 took part in the 105th edition of PaperWeek Canada. Over 250 participants from mills were also registered for the event, making the event one of the best industry events in the world ratio-wise. Furthermore, the PaperWeek tradeshow was sold out with close to 45 exhibitors present to showcase their services and technology.

The Opening Breakfast CEO Panel on the industry's future and the rise of the forest bioeconomy set the tone for the week. The PaperWeek and BIOFOR joint luncheons were a smashing success all week, with the very first panel on "Advancing Women in Leadership Roles" as one of the underlying highlights of this year's conference.

Finland's Ambassador to Canada set the stage for Thursday's PAPTAC Awards' Luncheon, with a strong emphasis on the great historical relationship between the Finnish and Canadian Forest industry. PAPTAC ambassadors and leaders were recognized during the Awards ceremony for their work and dedication to our Association and the Pulp & Paper and Forest Industry, with Dr. Theo van de Ven being awarded PAPTAC's highest recognition: the John S. Bates Gold Medal.

Technical and managerial sessions were crowded, thanks to the great and timely program that was put in place, and the networking coffee breaks and receptions allowed participants to interact with their peers and exchange on their learnings and experience, one of the greatest value of participating in the conference.

BIOFOR International 2019



Held in conjunction with PaperWeek, BIOFOR INTERNATIONAL, dedicated to the advancements of the global forest bioeconomy, was again the largest conference in Canada focusing on most important issues in the forest products sector.

The conference kicked-off Tuesday February 5th with a Welcoming address by Marzouk Benali, Conference Chair, followed by an Opening Keynote Speech by Dr. Stéphane Renou, CEO of FPInnovations.

Dr. Niklas von Weymarn, CEO of Metsä Spring, Finland, had the pleasure to be the first BIOFOR 2019 Keynote speaker under the MARKET DEVELOPMENT segment.

Highlights of this edition were two timely Panels. The first one, on Advanced Biomaterials and Nanomaterials, moderated by Minh Tan Ton-That, National Research Council, Canada, walked participants though the most important progress made in science and technology of bio-based materials and nanomaterials in the last decade, and addressed the issues and challenges associated with entering new markets and a competitive time-to-market.

The second panel, on Emerging Biorefinery Technologies & Enabling Large-scale Projects, reviewed the emerging biorefinery technologies for the production of bio-crudes and renewable drop-in fuels, and addressed the scale-up and investment challenges. The panel also discussed the state-of-the art of the development methodologies for large-scale biorefineries, the role of policy to speed the transition towards the bioeconomy, and shared the know-how and key lessons learned from on-going projects in Canada.
