The Association counts close to 3000 men and women as its members. Most are employed in paper mills, in private or publicly supported research organizations, in universities, government departments, consulting firms, and in companies which supply the industry. Membership is also open to students and librarians, and persons who have retired from careers in the industry. Approximately 80% of these members are located in Canada; the remainder is found in many other pulp and paper producing countries.

The organization was founded in 1915 as the Technical Section of the Canadian Pulp and Paper Association. On September 30, 1998 it was incorporated under the name of Pulp and Paper Technical Association of Canada (PAPTAC) as an independent not-for-profit association.

PAPTAC is a wide and well-organized network of professionals and provides access to valuable information and experiences that benefit the professional development of its members, and the pulp and paper industry as a whole. You are invited to get actively involved in the industry by joining our technical committees, by attending conferences and presenting papers, and by participating in TECH courses and webinars. Another Successful Edition of PaperWeek Virtual in 2022!



PAPTAC is proud to announce PaperWeek 2022 marked another record attendance of 969 participants, including 741 from Mills!

CANADA With so many participants from 56 mills representing 21 Pulp & Paper companies, PaperWeek was attended by the vast majority of the sector's operations with coastto-coast participation. Close to 130 experts shared their work in over 40 sessions throughout the 4 days of the conference, giving participants another great week of learning. Bringing together key stakeholders, experts, and professionals from across the country and beyond, the virtual conference served as a testament to the industry's commitment to knowledge sharing, collaboration, and progress. Despite the physical distance that separated participants, the virtual platform seamlessly facilitated engaging presentations, insightful panel discussions, and interactive networking sessions.

As attendees logged off from this edition of PaperWeek, they carried with them not only newfound knowledge but also a sense of unity and optimism that will undoubtedly drive the industry forward into a future defined by innovation and sustainability.



BIOFOR International 2022

Again in 2022, the BIOFOR Conference, which focuses on the forest bioeconomy, was an integral part of the PaperWeek Program. Along with keynote and technical presentations, the program featured key specialists in roundtables and panels.

The first Roundtable, "Biorefinery Transformation 101: Tutorial on Designing the Biorefinery", was the first of two tutorial sessions to overview some practical approaches for setting a sustainable biorefinery strategy.

A Technical Panel entitled "Policies, standards, and certifications to support the deployment of the Canadian bioeconomy" showcased how common ground discussions and consensus between the various stakeholders support the development of emerging pathways for the valorization and commercialization of wide spectrum of bioproducts, using standards and/or regulations.

Finally the technical panel on "Advances in Digitalization: Supporting Forestry Industry Competitiveness, Sustainability and Energy Use Reduction" followed the success of BIOFOR 2021's technical panel on the emerging era of digitalization in the forest products sector, with the same international panel of renowned experts reunited to present the state-of-art on digitalization, including advanced analytics, Industry 4.0 for energy use reduction, sharing data across supply chains, telemetry, and much more.
